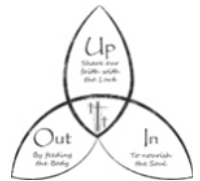

## Confession and Absolution

**P** Our rejoicing this day is tempered by the reality that although our gracious God has declared us to be saints – holy in His sight, one with those who have preceded us to heaven-while living on earth, we continue to sin. Let us therefore confess our sins, confident of God's mercy and grace for Jesus' sake.

**P** In the Beatitudes, Jesus called "blessed" those who are poor in spirit, meek, and hungering after righteousness.

**C** We confess that we have sought our personal happiness; we have striven to gain power; and we have neglected the disadvantaged and oppressed people around us. Forgive us in Your mercy, Lord Jesus.

*Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.*

**P** In the Beatitudes, Jesus called “blessed” those who are merciful, pure in heart, and peacemakers.

**C** We confess that we have sought our own advantage; we have become distracted from God's will for us; and we have let conflicts go unresolved. Forgive us in Your mercy, Lord Jesus.

**P** In the Beatitudes, Jesus calls us to rejoice. He knows our failings and forgives them; in His infinite mercy He calls us His saints, united with prophets, apostles, and martyrs who have gone before us. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

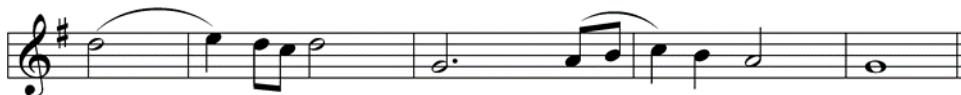

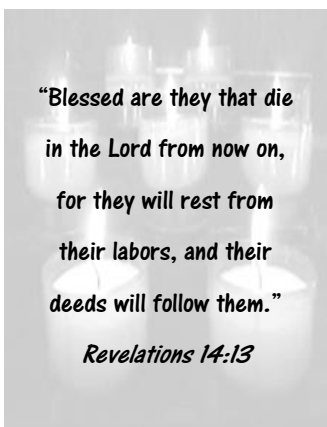
